HOW TO RECYCLE (ALMOST) EVERYTHING GUIDE 2013

Recycling is the easiest thing each of us can do 365 days a year to cut taxes, save energy, conserve natural resources and create jobs. If we all take advantage of our simple Single Stream Recycling and Yard Waste curb-side pickup for most recyclables, Haverford Township can **save an additional \$260,000 per year**. If you want to go above and beyond, this guide will tell you how to recycle *ALMOST* anything. **Be green, save more green!** To Recycle Everything:

- **Single Stream Recycling** – for a complete guide and schedules for curb-side pickup of most metal, paper, plastic - see the [Recycling Web Page](#).
- **Yard Waste** – Yard waste up to 3' long and 1 ½" diameter can be picked up from your curb! For rules and schedules, see the [Yard Waste Web Page](#)
- **Bulk Trash Pickup** – Large items, like appliances that don't contain Freon, are picked up and many are recycled. To arrange pickup, see the [Bulk Trash Web Page](#).
- **Recycle Almost Everything Else – USE THIS GUIDE!**

APPLIANCES CONTAINING FREON

Appliances containing Freon, including refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, humidifiers, dehumidifiers, and water coolers, must have the Freon removed prior to being recycled. DO NOT attempt to do this yourself.

When buying a new appliance, sellers will pick up your old unit and must recycle the Freon – most for a fee but some for free. EPA “[RAD](#)” Partners also commit to recycling mercury, foam, PCBs and used oil from appliances (currently Sears, Home Depot and Best Buy). In addition to [Best Buy](#), which will remove a variety of large appliances from your home for a fee, the following local companies will also remove Freon and dispose of your appliance. These companies typically charge a fee for pickup, but several offer free drop-off. Please call for applicable charges and more information.

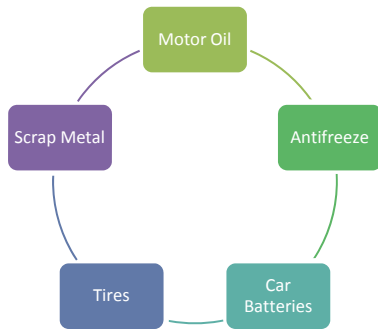

APPLIANCES NOT CONTAINING FREON

Haverford Township provides bulk trash pickup for washers, dryers, water heaters and kitchen appliances not containing Freon (as well as other large household items). Pay in advance and schedule pickup date (collections are on Wednesdays). AUTOMOTIVE PRODUCTS & WASTE



IMPORTANT:

- **DO NOT** pour used oil or antifreeze on the ground or down any drain or storm sewer
- **DO NOT** burn used oil except in an EPA approved waste oil furnace.
- **DO NOT** mix used oil with any other liquid.
- Collect used fluids in clean, unbreakable containers with tight-fitting caps.

The following local service stations have advised us they accept automotive wastes, as indicated. Others may take these items, if asked and a [County-Wide list](#) is also available. EVERY automotive battery seller will give a substantial credit (e.g., \$5 at Autozone, \$12 at Pep Boys) for car battery return. It is advisable to call before you go to verify hours of operation, categories of accepted wastes, and whether there is a nominal charge for their service. ** Please **DO NOT** leave items at a business after hours.

BATTERIES - ALKALINE

Alkaline batteries (everyday household batteries used in flashlights, remote controls, and other appliances) can now be safely disposed of in the regular trash.

However, if you wish to recycle them so the zinc and potassium they contain is recovered and reused, some organizations accept them for recycling (usually for a fee). RecycleLights.com (Wayne, PA) has a [mail-in program](#) for all batteries.

To find other alkaline battery recycling centers, call 1-800-RECYCLING or visit www.1800recycling.com.

Remember:

- ✓ **Never** dispose of batteries in fire because they could explode.
- ✓ **Never** dispose of large amounts of alkaline batteries in a group, which can create safety risks.

CDs/DVDs

In addition to the paper inserts, as long as the case has a #1-7 plastics code, it can go directly in your curbside recycling bin (most cases are labeled #6 or # 7).

Do NOT place the CDs and DVDs themselves in your recycling bin. They will be accepted at:

CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE

Construction and demolition debris is non-hazardous, uncontaminated material from construction, renovation or repair. This includes asphalt, brick, carpet, carpet padding, ceiling tiles, ceramic tile, concrete, dirt, doors, drywall, furniture, hardware, light fixtures, linoleum, lumber, mattresses, metals, pallets, porcelain products, roofing materials, sand, sawdust, shingles, stone and tile. The following local companies accept a variety of construction and demolition materials for recycling, including “mixed streams” collected in a single dumpster. Drop-off and dumpster services are available. Disposal fees may apply. Please contact for additional information.

Checklist:

- ✓ Has a cord
- ✓ Does NOT contain Freon (air conditioner, dehumidifiers, small refrigerators)
- ✓ Is NOT a large appliance

This non-profit organization accepts donations of plastic eyeglasses, reading glasses and sunglasses in good condition and metal eyeglasses in any condition, as well as hearing aids, watches, jewelry, silverware and giftware. Eyeglasses in good condition are sent to medical missions and international charitable organizations for distribution to the poor in developing nations. Proceeds for the sale of scrap metal, hearing aids, jewelry and giftware are used to support the U.S. eyeglass voucher program. Shipping costs are tax-deductible.

What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)? Typically, labels that contain the words **HAZARDOUS, DANGER, WARNING, POISONOUS** or **TOXIC** indicate items that contain hazardous material which may be HHW if disposed.

Types of HHW that will be accepted

- Oil-Based Paint, Paint Thinner, Varnish, Rust/Paint Remover
- Non-Alkaline Batteries-- Lithium, Ni-Cad, Rechargeable, Lead Acid, Button
- Compact Fluorescent Light Bulbs and Tubes
- Mercury Switches, Thermostats, Thermometers
- Weed Killers, Fungicides, Pesticides
- Kerosene, Gasoline, Gas/Oil Mixture, Heating/Motor Oil, Antifreeze
- Cleaners, Solvents, Pool Chemicals
- Cell Phones

What will NOT be accepted

- Medical Waste, Radioactive Waste, Unidentified Waste, Asbestos, PCBs
- Tires
- Explosives, Ammunition
- Gas Cylinders
- Pressurized CFCs
- Large Appliances, Air Conditioners, Other Items Containing Freon
- Latex Paint *
- Alkaline Batteries*
- Smoke Detectors (return to manufacturer)

* Note that alkaline batteries (see above) & latex paint (see below) are NOT hazardous. These items can be disposed of in your regular trash, following the procedures explained in this guide.

LIGHT BULBS – COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS

Compact fluorescent light bulbs and fluorescent tubes contain mercury. Please **DO NOT** throw them in the trash - that can lead to a release of mercury into the environment through breakage and leakage. In Delaware County bulbs placed in the trash are ultimately incinerated. You can recycle them at:

LIGHT BULBS – INCANDESCENT, HALOGEN, LED

Residents can dispose of incandescent and non-mercury-containing light bulbs, including halogen bulbs and LED bulbs, in the regular trash, although they do contain lead and can be recycled as described above for fluorescent bulbs. Rules differ for commercial facilities.

** Please **DO NOT** try to recycle your old light bulbs with your glass bottles and jars. They are made from a different type of glass and also contain metal parts.

MEDICATION & MEDICAL WASTE

Delaware County is participating in the [2013 National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day](#) at 16 locations in the County on **Saturday, April 27th, 2013** from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity to safely dispose of unwanted, unused prescription drugs. Collection sites include:

The program is anonymous. Prescription and over-the-counter solid dosage medications (i.e., tablets, capsules) will be accepted. IV solutions, injectables, liquids and needles will **NOT** be accepted.

Alternatively, dispose medications in your regular trash (ours is incinerated, a good method for medications) but take these precautions to prevent theft or accidental release during trash handling:

- Remove label with personal information and “overpack” pill bottles inside a can or container, surrounding it with household trash such as coffee grounds, or
- Pour liquid into an empty liquid tight bottle or coffee can, add enough kitty litter or sawdust to cover and solidify medication, tighten and duct tape lid.

***** Please do not flush any medication down a drain or toilet unless specifically instructed to on packaging – pharmaceuticals can survive wastewater treatment and reach our rivers.*****

MOTOR OIL – See [Automotive Products & Waste](#)

PAINT – Latex

Although Latex paint is not hazardous, regular paint still contains a substantial amount of “VOC” pollutants. You can now buy “Zero-VOC” paints in most home or paint stores. The best practice is to use all the paint, when possible. Old latex paints can be blended together to make beige or grey paint.

Some organizations seasonally solicit gently used paints. The [Haverford High School Parent-Teacher-Student Association](#) often solicits latex paint contributions for the spring after prom “Blast”.

If you must dispose of partly used paint containers, open the lid, and let the remaining paint air dry, and leave the lids off when placing out with your regular trash.

If you have too much paint and it will not harden using this method, do the following:

- 1) Take two cardboard boxes, and line one with a black trash bag.
- 2) Place kitty litter in the trash bag, and add the paint. Stir, and add more kitty litter or shredded newspaper as necessary to allow paint to solidify. Once the paint is solidified, tie up the bag.
- 3) In the second box, place the empty cans of paints, with lids OFF.
- 4) Place both boxes out with your regular trash.

** Latex paints can be blended prior to disposal, but **DO NOT** mix oil-based paint with latex paint.

PAINT – Oil-Based

Unlike latex paint, oil-based paint is hazardous and cannot be disposed of in your regular trash. Instead, please bring any used oil-based paint to one of the [Delaware County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Events](#) (see above).

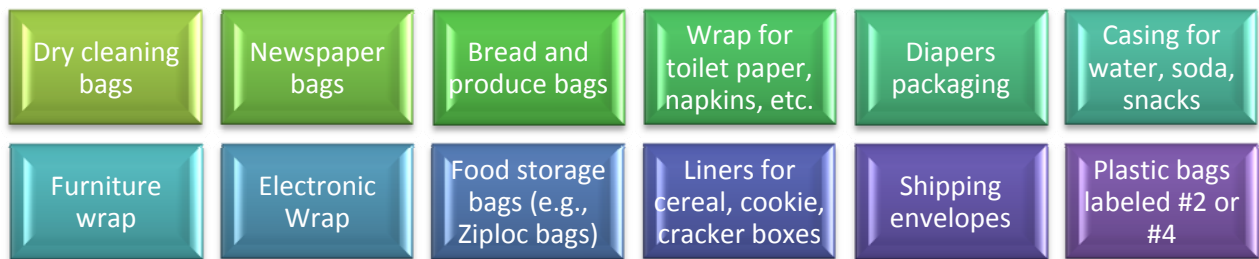
PACKING PEANUTS

Many shipping/packaging stores will accept clean packing peanuts for reuse including your [local UPS store](#). Please call your local packing store for more information.

PLASTIC BAGS, FILMS AND WRAPS

Most major grocery store chains and many retailers have recycling kiosks at their entrances that accept plastic bags, film and wraps for recycling, including ACME, Giant, SuperFresh, Kohl's & Target.

Keep in mind that plastic bags are not just limited to retail shopping bags. They also include:

Almost any common metal, motor or appliance can be dropped off at [Accurate Recycling](#) in Darby and Lansdowne. Accurate pays for valuable metals (aluminum, copper, brass, lead, etc.) and large amounts of less valuable metals. Smaller quantities of steel and cast iron can be dropped off in a dumpster at Accurate at no cost. Dumpsters and pickups available for commercial quantities. Call for current prices.

SECURE DOCUMENT SHREDDING/RECYCLING

Do not place secure information (e.g., anything with a social security number) in curb-side recycling. You can tear off sensitive information and recycle the rest of it or you can shred it. Shredders are available in office supply stores. Secure shredding services are offered by commercial paper recyclers, archive storage firms and shredding specialists. Check Business Directory listings under “Shredding Service”. Look for future announcements on additional secure shredding options for residents.

SHARPS/SYRINGES

Sharps or syringes are not considered household hazardous waste. They can be disposed in the regular trash after taking certain precautions. Place them in a puncture-resistant hard plastic (e.g., detergent-type) or metal container, seal it and place it in a securely fastened opaque trash bag. It is also recommended to disinfect sharps with a solution of one teaspoon of bleach in a half gallon of water. SMOKE DETECTORS

Most smoke detectors contain a small amount of radioactive material called Americium-241 and should be returned to their manufacturer for proper disposal. When returning a smoke detector to the manufacturer, include a note that indicates “For Disposal”.
